Providence Monthly Meeting for Worship with a Concern for Business 10th of Fourth Month, 2022 Minutes

Friends gathered by Zoom technology at 12:15 with 15 present. Presiding clerk Victoria Ekk began the period of silent worship by reading the following queries taken from Philadelphia Yearly Meeting's *Faith and Practice*, Queries on Nurturing Community: *Do we help each other to live with integrity and contribute that integrity to the life of our meeting?*

How does our meeting learn of members' needs and offer its assistance?

How does our meeting nurture members in all stages of life?

The clerk read the following announcements:

- We are looking to reopen the Nursery for our young families and are seeking nursery assistants over the age of 18 to help support parents in watching children from ages 1-4 on Sundays.
- We will have a worship sharing about Meeting for Worship formats on Sunday, May 1, immediately following our combined Meeting for Worship so that both in person and online participants can participate.

The following items were brought forward:

Coffee Hour. Eugenia Marks reported that coffee hour will resume next week. Weather permitting, Friends will take their refreshments outside for socializing.

Concerning the group, "**Neighborhood Convening for Healing and Mutual Support**," Victoria Ekk reported that plans are being made for an outdoor social event to be held in Billy Taylor Park and involving people from the East Side/ Mt. Hope area. Marcus Mitchell is leading the effort.

Peace and Social Action Committee Report. The Committee brought information about a march being organized by the Poor People's Campaign; the march will take place in Washington, D. C. on

The Committee also reported that a possible silent vigil supporting the United Nations Treaty in Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons may take place at the R.I. State House at a time to be determined.

Letter for Rebecca Leuchak. The Clerk brought a letter of introduction and travel for Rebecca Leuchak. As rising Clerk of New England Yearly Meeting, Rebecca will be visiting many monthly and quarterly meetings during the coming months. The letter is attached.

Nominating Committee. Dan Lederer brought the Committee's list of proposed committee memberships for the coming fiscal year. The Nursery was discussed, Friends noting that we currently have only two people on the Nursery Committee and no staff. Several methods of staffing the nursery have been tried over the years. Eugenia Marks stated that the Religious Education Committee has begun looking for people to work in the nursery. Friends approved the list.

Endorsement letter proposed. Peace and Social Action Committee proposed that our Meeting send a letter to members of the R.I. Senate and House of Representatives, with copies to Rhode Island's federal Senators and Representatives, endorsing R. I. House Bill 2022-H7518 and pending companion Senate bill, regarding efforts to prevent nuclear war, and also that we inform New England Yearly Meeting of our actions. We approve, and direct our Clerk to write suitable letters.

No further business appearing, we closed with a period of silent worship at 1:15 p.m., intending to meet next on the 8th of Fifth month.

Worship Sharing Regarding Meeting for Worship May 1

from Ministry and Counsel

On Sunday May 1, Ministry and Counsel Committee will be sponsoring a worship sharing to address the following query:

In our efforts to adapt to the COVID pandemic, Meeting has offered a variety of worship experiences, these being indoors with restrictions (vaccination, masks, social distancing), outdoors, online, and "hybrid". While many Friends have found one or more of these types of worship to be spiritually satisfying, others have not. The public health situation seems to be improving but there is no guarantee it will continue to do so. How then should we proceed?

May 1 is a day when we have a combined, or hybrid, Meeting for Worship, i.e., Friends who are meeting online are able to see and hear Friends in the Providence meetinghouse, and those of us who are in the meetinghouse can hear those who are online. Discussion of the above query will take place immediately after Meeting for

Worship and will include both the in-person and the online Friends. Our presiding clerk will moderate and will initially give each person in attendance the opportunity to speak, after which there will be a more open discussion. We had a similar online gathering on March 8 to try to reconcile the Quaker peace testimony with the conflict in Ukraine, and it was quite interesting and enlightening. This discussion promises to be the same.

In the process of preparing the annual State of the Society report, Ministry and Counsel recently asked for input from Friends, many of whom expressed their leadings regarding the topic of Meeting for Worship, and the committee has noted these comments. Message from Ukraine

This message was posted by anti-violence trainers at Alternatives to Violence (AVP) Ukraine, dated April 6:

It is very painful to absorb everything that is going on. It is hard to restrain one's emotions, while hearing the testimony of witnesses or looking at the photographs, photographs of people who have been killed, photographs of towns that have been destroyed. Yet, still, we bear in mind that within us is the Transforming Power. This is the Power which enables us to transform hot anger into inspiration, despair into help for those around us, horror into love for those near to us, rage into readiness to set to work. Now, as never before, we need each other. And this means that we are called to stand faithful, to stay emotionally in equilibrium.

Stop for a moment, take a pause. You will find, either within yourself or without, a lever,

which enables us to shift all the force out of hatred and into making peace. This is us — we are the peacemakers. Creators of peace, defenders of the light.

Clerk's Corner: Responding Rather Than Reacting

April showers are real and sometimes it is true that when it rains, it pours! How often have all of us had to deal with several crises at the same time? That seems to be the way this month has started, not just in Providence, but around the world. There is a contrast between the hope spring brings to our hearts and minds and the reality of constraints, challenges and unhappy surprises that have also come to life at this time.

Have you ever found yourself making quicker decisions because so many are needed? That mix of happy/sad, hopeful/doubtful feelings brought about by the stresses of making multiple decisions at once is often what gets me to slow down and seek guidance more earnestly. A good Friend and I were chatting today about the difference between reaction and response. Reaction comes when something happens and my feelings rise up to meet the situation, but sometimes, the feelings take over and that's not always a good thing. Response happens when I take time

to wait, be silent and seek the Teacher within me. Very often, responding rather than reacting to a situation is the wiser path to take.

How often do I seek guidance so I can respond rather than react? Is it only for the "important" things? I am told that Sweetwater Nannauck, of the Tlingit tribe in Washington, prays before she answers each phone call, seeking guidance for every decision. I believe that is what George Fox and John Woolman modeled for us, the importance of slowing down and seeking guidance in that peaceful silence that is so dear to us as Friends! Centering myself in that Light, the love and wisdom that comes from it, enables me to respond and seek the good even in the midst of unexpected challenges.

So, lots is going on in April as we: reopen coffee hour, one step at a time, on April 17; find a way to reopen our nursery so young families can join us in worship; work on plans to build relationships and support neighbors in the Mt. Hope area; foster kinship with the Pokanoket and Narraganset tribes; have rich and deep sharing on Meeting for Worship formats; find a way to organize groups to set up more apartments for the likelihood of additional refugees coming to Providence; provide Alternative to Violence workshops to a variety of relevant groups in our area, and so much more! But more importantly, and more simply, let's take time to constantly listen for the inward Teacher to lead us towards growing spiritually and be able to "walk cheerfully over the earth answering that of God in everyone." (George Fox)
