# Providence Monthly Meeting for Worship with a Concern for Business 8th of Tenth Month, 2023 Minutes

Friends gathered at the Providence meetinghouse at noon with 13 present and 5 on Zoom. Presiding clerk Ariana Steele began the period of silent worship by reading the following queries taken from New England Yearly Meeting Advices and Queries:

Do you recognize divinely inspired insight? Can you distinguish between divine leadings and your own needs or desires?

To whom or to what are you accountable?

The clerk informed Friends that Quarterly Meeting will be held next week on the 15th day of 10th month, at Westerly Friends Meetinghouse in Westerly, RI.

The following items of business were brought forward:

- 1. From Finance Committee: the Meeting's financial records have been reviewed by an audit committee consisting of William Monroe and Matthew Hackman, who reported that the records appear to be in good order and without any material discrepancies. The auditors and treasurer identified some areas for which modifications of process may be proposed to a future Meeting for Business. Friends accepted the report.
- 2. For Ministry and Counsel Committee, Dan Lederer reported that the wedding of Heather Meehan and Felix Hagen took place on Ninth month 18 in accordance with the good order of Friends.
- 3. Em McManamy and Bob Watt reported on their recent trip to Cuba, working on the Alternatives to Violence Project (PAV in Spanish). They worked with an enthusiastic group of Cuban Friends who intend bringing the AVP/ PAV program to their local areas. Friends are invited to speak with Em or Bob to get more information about their experiences.
- 4. Peace and Social Action Committee requested that Providence Meeting authorize a sister meeting relationship between our Meeting and the Floro Perez Quaker Meeting, a small programmed meeting in Cuba, which joins in the request. This relationship would be in accordance with the Puente de Amigos (Bridge of Friends) program of New England Yearly Meeting; it is intended to foster spiritual relationships with Cuban Friends and to facilitate intervisitation, but there are no specific requirements or obligations. Friends noted that some social and religious beliefs and practices in Cuba may be different from those held by many Friends here. We also noted the opportunity for all of us to learn from one another. Friends approved the request. We ask Peace and Social Action Committee to establish a subcommittee for this purpose.
- 5. Nominating Committee proposed Meredith Stern, Vivian Liu, and Dan Rounseville as additional members of the Religious Education Committee. Friends approved.

No further business appearing, we closed with a period of silent worship at 1:20 p.m., intending to meet next on the 12th of Eleventh month at the Providence meetinghouse.

#### **How Quakerism Challenges Us**

Rather than provide Friends with ready answers to difficult questions, Quakerism presents some challenging propositions that set the seeker on a path to greater understanding.

First, Friends are asked to accept the premise that there is that of God in every person, which then challenges each of us to explore the nature of God and figure out how we relate to that which we consider sacred. Questions inevitably arise: For example, is God present only in humans or in all living things? And if the latter, what about inanimate objects? Do we turn to God only when we are in need, or do we seek to appreciate God's presence everywhere and at all times?

A second challenge is related to the Quaker testimonies represented by the acronym SPICES: simplicity, peace, integrity, community, equality, and stewardship. The challenge here is first to interpret what the testimonies mean to us, and then to find how to implement them in our own lives.

Again, questions arise. Some examples: Does living with simplicity mean giving up some of the things we consider necessities, such as cable TV? Does advocating for peace require us to oppose all war, and, if so, what is our proposal for resolving the conflict in Ukraine that doesn't result in that country's fragmentation and loss of democracy? If we aspire to a life of integrity, how do we prevent principles from becoming rigidity? How do we balance our personal lives with our obligation to the Meeting community and to the larger community as a whole? What's the best way to promote equality at home, in our work, and in our politics? And how do we preserve the planet while simultaneously providing food and energy to its numerous inhabitants?

There are no easy answers to these questions. Although it's often useful to consider the guidance of others on these issues, the beauty of Quakerism is that no one is telling us what to believe or how to proceed. Rather, it's up to each of us to determine our own response to these challenges, and that entails a process of ongoing seeking. If we follow that path, it becomes a journey of continual discovery, which, in my mind, is what makes Quakerism so interesting.
